# A new opportunity from the "Misk Initiatives" for our students to grant nominations.

A group of students from Dhahran Private Schools are nominated to join the Mohammed bin Salman bin Abdul-Aziz Charitable Foundation (MiSK) within the "Fellowship Program" which aims to meet the aspirations of male and female students to enroll in one of the best international universities, through an intensive training program that accompanies the student during his/her education in the secondary level and will last for two years, the program is based on enhancing the chances of accepting high school students in a selection of universities in the world, including the universities of "Columbia", "Stanford" in the United States, and "Oxford" and "Cambridge" in Britain, so that male and female students are enrolled in A series of Intensive qualifying programs, to build a personality that suits college lives, and enable safe passage towards university education and academic life the student aspires to join.

The first stage of the "Preparing for college" program targets first-year secondary students by enrolling them in the summer of the first year in a training program that simulates the future academic experience inside one of the world's most prestigious universities, and extends to seven weeks during which the student lives in details of university life, and he/she engages in many academic activities, within the corridors of the university. Female students: Leen almhanna and Sulafah Al-Shehri, Lyn Al-Faraj, Lamar Al-Kaka, Hala Al-Qallaf, Silaf Al-Juhani, Nova Al-Dossary, Rand Al-Naji and Mayar Al-Halili have been enrolled in it. It is worth noting that the "Preparing for college" program comes within the programs of the "Misk Fellowship and Training" initiative, which was launched by the "Misk Initiatives" Center to prepare students for the future, and enable them to enroll in the comprehensive development program for the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, by providing them with the latest knowledge and skills in the light of goals of the Saudi Vision 2030.






# 'The Annual Reading Festival' a cultural lighthouse

A visit of 'development team for KG and Nurseries Curriculum' from the General Administration

Our schools hosted a delegation of 36 members from the General Administration of Early Childhood in the Ministry of Education and the American National Childhood Association, on Sunday 1/6/1441 AH corresponding to 26/1/2020 within their program to develop curricula for nurseries and kindergartens, and the delegation included general supervisors for early childhood from all over The Kingdom and the managers of training centers and professors from King Saud University in Riyadh and King Abdulaziz University in Jeddah and representatives from the American National Committee NAEYC, to observe the classroom environment in nurseries and what they contain from tools to corners as well as the way children interact during the daily program starting from the age of infants to toddlers, and the team chacked the language skills that are presented to children, daily routines, and self-service skills for older children, and the delegation expressed their admiration for the efforts made in the nursery and introductory classes. Our school library has been presented with a gifted book (The Right Development Practices for Infants and Toddlers) and some children's stories in Arabic by representatives of the National Committee American to early grades.
