Below are some of the students' projects that demonstrate their wide range of interests and skills.

Ms. Arshia Zaheer supervised six projects:

- Sadeem Alnahdi: "Keeping Up with Locals" where she created an <u>Instagram account</u> to support local entrepreneurs and small businesses.
- Hala Almajed: "Hala's Novel Quarters" in which she reviews novels on her blog.
- **Joori Alheraiqi:** "Silent Melodies" in which she learns sign language and translates a song into sign language.
- **Joory Alamer:** "Behind Each Painting" where she writes a story about morals with every painting she painted on Instagram.
- Leena AlDughaither: "Discover the Recipe to a Restaurant's Success" in which she created a blog reviewing restaurants food, menu, atmosphere, location, etc.
- Sara Al Moslem: "French Poetry" where she learned French and created a website featuring her French poems.

And in an effort to identify gifted innovators an idea was born to form a national joint project implemented by exper
national authorities with qualified personnel in this field.

A model was developed to identify the gifted with an advanced scientific methodology based on the most important scientific foundations and educational best practices to ensure the adequate selection of promising students.

Through this model a large database of gifted public education students in the Kingdom was created, and continues to grow.
