

Students Counselling

Our students in the elementary level are actively interacting with what is being presented in the counselling classes (Bullying Unit) through applying several practices in accordance with the training program **Second Step** that implements multiple goals, concepts, videos of different situations, stories, songs and practices. They demonstrated a deep understanding to the unit's goals and the IB learner profile. Our students now have the ability to recognize all types of bullying, especially the online bullying and how to report it, refuse it and stop it.



Counsellors in the intermediate and the secondary level have helped the students to understand themselves and to know their abilities and how to overcome the struggles they encounter in order to Achieve psychological, educational, social, professional, health and behavioural balance to build a well-adjusted personality through the following:

- Follow up on educational, psychological and academic cases in order to find out aspects of strength in the students and address their improvement.
- Providing guidance to support the process of psychological and academic growth, by offering sessions through Teams (individuals or groups), as well as teaching students academic programs, psychological and life skills concerned with developing learning, study skills and life skills: time management, writing goals, and reprocessing the negative thoughts, positive self-talk, relationships and ways of dealing with others and many other themes and topics that Second Step offer.

Ms. Ameena Tabassum supervises 4 projects and they are:




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KG3 Celebrating "Sharing the Planet" Theme

They have innovatively created several ways of communication like drawing, writing on a board, sign language and texting. 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Early Screening Test for School Students

Based on the Ministry of Health's policy of preventive medicine, and early screening and detection of diseases, the exploratory examination program for school students is meant to represent a major step in this direction in a way that positively affects the health of young people, the screening test program for school students aims to start an early detection of a number of health problems, and includes investigating the student's disease history, completion of vaccinations, carrying out preventive measures, as well as an early detection for obesity, weight gain, excessive weight loss, tooth decay, visual problems, depression, ADHD, curvature of the vertebral spine, hearing examination, learning difficulties, and smoking. It targets first and fourth graders, and it will be applied by the governmental health centers.

Objectives of the early screening test:

- 1. Early screening for hearing, vision and physical problems.
- 2. Create a health database for school students.
- 3. Monitor levels of growth and physical and psychological developments for students.
- Early screening of students' diseases or troubles (refer them to the specialized centres and advocate their families about the concerns)

Parents are kindly requested to do the following:



- 1. Book an appointment in **Mawid** application, we encourage parents to hurry up to register their children as soon as possible.
- Accompany your child during the examination (1 companion only), with adhering to the precautionary measures during your visit to the health centre (wearing a mask – physical distancing).
