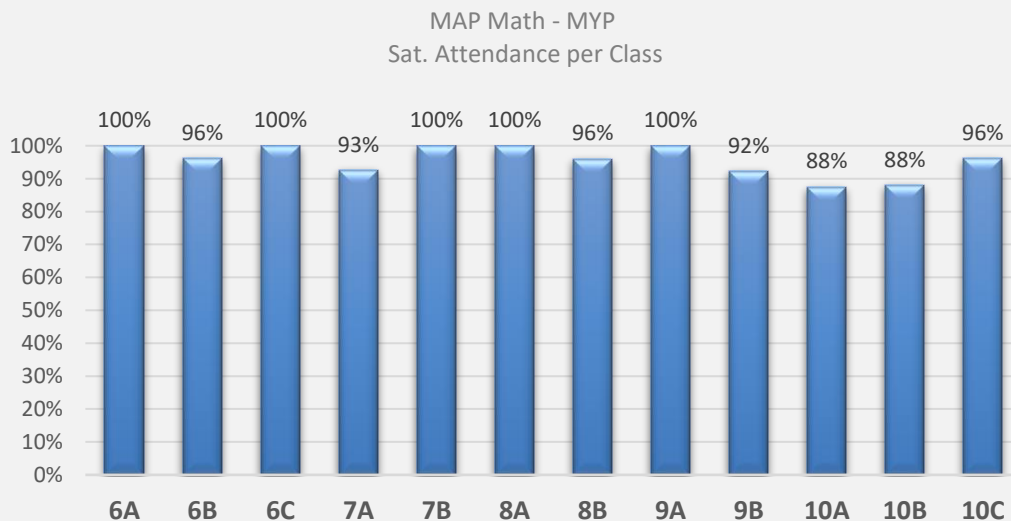
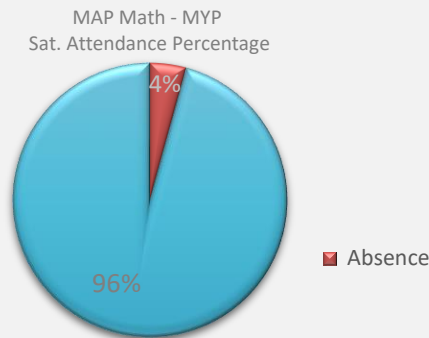
Evacuation Drill

Internal Training for our Teachers, according to the School's Plan for continuous progress

To achieve the school's mission "Every year we will be better than the year before," DAS works on internal training for continuing and new teachers that includes topics selected for the educational and learning teams in schools, reflections on educational experience and training presentations.

The training program includes all kinds of academic categories and provides training topics that are compatible with each training level, including classroom management and understanding through planning, school discipline with honesty, clubs, vocabulary in all subjects and computer skills, all that to guarantee the best education strategies for our students.

During the summer return period, the training program included the requirements of teachers and continuing teachers, such as how to write goals and action plans, review educational units and reflect or improve through discussions in academic meetings.
