Coffee, dates and traditional sweets were served by our students. A Saudi traditional corner was also placed at the main entrance that contained a set of tools used in the past, such as mortar and wicker baskets. The entrance was also decorated with drawings that were created by our students to show their love and support for the country. Students throughout all levels have shown feelings of attachment to their country and appreciation to its guardians as well as their support and commitment to the 2030 vision because they're aware of their responsibilities to participate in achieving this vision.

The program of the occasion was prepared and executed by our students who included several activities:

The National Program for Gifted Identification

Inspired by the vision of King Abdullah bin Abdulaziz—may God have mercy on him—and driven by the unwavering support from the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia's leadership for identifying and nurturing gifted individuals, a joint national program has been developed. This initiative aims to unify and enhance current efforts to discover, and support gifted and innovative individuals. It will be implemented by key national organizations with extensive experience and qualified teams in this field. This program reflects a strong commitment to recognizing the vital role of this exceptional group in transforming the Kingdom into a knowledge-based society, ultimately contributing to sustainable development.

Objectives:

- Identify gifted male and female students in the fields of science and technology across the Kingdom.
- Develop a comprehensive system and methodology for identifying gifted students.
- Ensure fairness and equity in the selection process for gifted students, directing them to suitable support programs.
- Create a detailed database of gifted students throughout the Kingdom.
- Raise community awareness about the traits of gifted students and the importance of their identification.
- Enhance scientific research resources and contribute to the Arab library on the topic of gifted student identification.

Nomination Requirements/Registration:

- The student must belong to the targeted age group (from third grade of elementary school to the 10th grade).
- Commitment to the program's guidelines and policies is required.
- Registration for the Mawhiba Test for Multiple Mental Abilities must be completed through the Qiyas website.
- Students must confirm their attendance for the test and pay the fees (self-nomination).

Students are allowed to enter the assessment once at each level:

- First Level: Third, fourth, and fifth grades of elementary school
- Second Level: Sixth grade of elementary school and 7th and 8th grades of intermediate school
- Third Level: 9th grade of intermediate school and 10th grade of secondary school

Targeted Group:

The assessment is aimed at students in public, private, and international schools, as well as those attending Saudi schools abroad.

Registration Periods:

- First Registration Period: October 16 to November 18, 2024
- Second Registration Period: November 19 to January 13, 2025

Measurement centres will be opened to accommodate those wishing to register for all tests offered by the centre, which may limit the availability of seats.



Mawhoub Competition

Mawhoub Competition:

This annual scientific competition targets students from the first year of intermediate school to the first year of secondary school. Its goal is to identify exceptional students in science, mathematics, physics, chemistry, and biology, and to enroll them in specialized training programs that prepare them for participation in international competitions and Olympiads.

Targeted Group:

General education students from the 7^{th} grade to the 10^{th} grade, based on their academic grade for the year 1446, are categorized as follows:

- Science and Mathematics Specialization: Targets students in the 7th and 8th grades.
- Chemistry, Physics, and Biology Specialization: Targets students in the 9th and 10th grades.

Objectives of the Competition:

- Identify gifted students.
- Support exceptional students through specialized training programs.
- Enhance the learning process.
- Nominate outstanding students to be included in international Olympiad teams.
