
10th Grade Students Showcase Their Creativity at Dhahran Ahliyya Schools' Mid-Term Personal Projects Exhibition

KG3 Students Explore the Power of Wheels in "Wheel Day" Activity

In alignment with the "How the World Works" Unit, which emphasizes that "Forces and motion make our lives easier," and the research line "Forces and motion around us (shape)," KG3 students at Dhahran Ahliyya Schools participated in a hands-on activity during the fourteenth week of the first semester.

Each student brought their own wheel-based objects from home—such as bicycles, scooters, and wheelchairs—to explore the fascinating world of wheels. In this interactive session, students took on the role of contemplative researchers, observing the wheels and their movement across different surfaces. They compared and analyzed how wheels perform on various roads by testing them in the schoolyard.

"Wheel Day" proved to be an engaging learning experience, encouraging students to think critically and discover the properties of wheels. They learned that the wheel, a circular shape, moves through a process known as rolling, and that its movement continues when forces are applied. Most importantly, students realized that wheels play a vital role in safely transporting objects quickly and efficiently. This activity supported the development of their observation, discovery, and critical thinking skills.





KG 1-2 Students Explore the Roles That Organize Society with Visit to Piatto Restaurant

As part of their unit on "How We Organize Ourselves," first and second kindergarten students at Dhahran Ahliyya Schools visited Piatto Restaurant to explore various roles that help organize society. They learned about the baker, cook, waiter, and receptionist, discovering how each contributes to the smooth running of the restaurant.

The students also had fun making their own pizzas and learned about the bus driver's role in getting them from school to the restaurant. This hands-on experience helped them better understand how different roles work together in daily life.













KG3 Students Explores Forces & Motion at Ithra

As part of the theme "How the World Works," which highlights how "Forces and Motion Make Our Lives Easier," KG3 students visited the King Abdulaziz Center for World Culture — Ithra in the fifteenth week of the semester. The students explored Saudi Arabia's ancient heritage, learning about the Sadu weaving technique and the forces involved in its creation. At the Children's Museum, they engaged in hands-on activities, experimenting with the movement of balls, pulling cylinders, using air to move cards, and more. The students shared ideas and discussed the different methods used in the force and motion games.

This trip deepened their understanding of kinetic forces while encouraging them to express their opinions and select their favorite Sadu designs, fostering ownership of their creativity.
