95th National Day Logo Panel





The Eastern Province branch of the Ministry of Human Resources and Social Development organized, under the generous patronage of His Royal Highness Prince Saud bin Bandar bin Abdulaziz — Deputy Prince of the Eastern Province, an initiative that reflected the spirit of cooperation between the public and private sectors in serving the country. It also emphasized the importance of community partnerships in ensuring the success of national events and enhancing identity and belonging.

On the occasion of the **95th National Day**, thousands of participants lined up at the **Khobar Corniche** to form the National Day slogan, representing the largest human panel in a celebratory display of Saudi National Day. This took place during an event launched by the **Khobar Labor Office Initiative** at the waterfront, with the participation of **3,000 volunteers**, **20 government entities**, and **12 community organizations**, forming the largest human embodiment of the National Day slogan at the Eastern Province level.

The initiative revolves around a large panel divided into **8 sections**, representing the components of the nation, reflecting national unity with the leadership. The panel was raised high to create a unique artistic image, marking the **largest panel in the Kingdom** in celebration of National Day. This initiative was led by the **Khobar Labor Office**, in partnership with the public and private sectors.
