We are immensely proud of Fatimah and Salma and warmly congratulate their families, as well as the teachers who inspired in them a love of learning and a spirit of discovery.






## Mothers' Attendance at Individual Meetings

# Your Volunteering Journey in the "Green Cities" Initiative Enhancing Green Coverage and

In support of environmental awareness and social responsibility, 34 middle and high school students from Dhahran Ahliyya Schools participated in the "Green Cities" Initiative organized by the Modon Authority.

The initiative aims to increase green spaces in industrial areas and reduce carbon emissions. Students helped plant 2,000 saplings as part of a larger plan to plant 10,000 across Dammam and Al-Ahsa, enhancing air quality and promoting sustainability in the Eastern Province.

The event brought together 15 factories and key partners, including the Saudi Red Crescent, Al-Mana Hospital, and Modon Authority, demonstrating strong collaboration between educational and industrial sectors in serving the environment.
